The year ended 31 December 1997

THE YEAR IN BRIEF

1997 has been another successful year for the Society with membership back up to record levels. Our members continue to show their support of members' seminars which have again been extremely well attended during the 1997 year.

MEMBERSHIP

The following table summarises the recent history of Society's membership.

The overwhelming majority of the members continues to be individual members and although the number of solicitors remains high, we have continued to see a growing number of non-lawyer members. Further, with 5 representatives per corporate member, this represents a new high in total numbers.

FINANCIAL POSITION

The Society remains in sound financial condition. At 31 October 1997, the Balance Sheet shows assets of \$14,867.26. This represents an operating profit of \$785.04.

MEMBERSHIP FEES

The Society's healthy financial position is such that the Management Committee has again resolved not to increase membership fees for 1997.

The 1997 fees are as follows:

Individual:	\$ 40
Corporate:	\$150
Articled Clerk	\$ 20
Student	\$ 20

There has been no fee increase since formation of the Society 7 years ago. Despite the relatively inexpensive fees, members would no doubt agree that membership benefits are substantial.
