Sweeping changes to the way Australia's energy markets are regulated mean a major shift affecting all energy users around the country.

The move to establish a new, independent regulatory body, the Australian Energy Regulator, promises not only a coordinated approach to Australia's previously fragmented energy markets for the first time, but also a real chance to drive down regulation costs for businesses.

In this edition of *Update*, new AER Chair Steve Edwell looks at what the new regime will mean, how it will affect the energy market and what it will mean for energy users.

We also take a look at how businesses involved in cartels that come forward can protect themselves from ACCC prosecution by applying for immunity, a recently introduced policy designed to help crack open illegal price-fixing deals.
