*A number of experienced practitioners in the crime prevention field have been invited to speak including:*

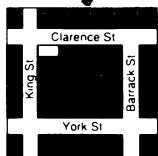
**NIGEL WHISKIN**, Chief Executive of Crime Concern, Swindon, England. Mr. Whiskin has worked for the past twenty years with voluntary agencies in the prison and community fields. He has been involved in work with young black offenders and in setting up accommodation and employment projects with a focus on crime prevention. Mr. Whiskin helped establish the first Victim Support Scheme in England in 1972. In 1978 he was appointed Assistant Director of the National Association for the Care and Rehabilitation of Offenders (NACRO) and established NACRO's Employment Training sector which developed

20,000 places for offenders. In 1988 he was appointed Chief Executive of Crime Concern. In 1990 he was appointed the UK correspondent to the European Forum on Urban Safety and in 1991 was appointed as an adviser to the Working Party considering the involvement of local authorities in crime prevention.

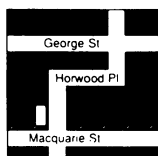
**CONSEILLER J.P. PLANTARD** of the French Cour de Cassation in Paris, France. Monsieur Plantard performs a role similar to that of Assistant Attorney-General and Director of Public Prosecutions. He is one of several distinguished overseas lawyers attending the 27th Australian Legal Convention to be held in Adelaide from 8th to 12th September 1991. His fields of interest include alternatives to imprisonment, the cost of justice, damages, juvenile diversion, and the confiscation of the proceeds of crime. He is expected to provide us with some insights into the Bonnemaïson concept of crime prevention.

**DUNCAN CHAPPELL**, Director of the Australian Institute of Criminology, Canberra. Professor Chappell has extensive experience in various areas of law and criminology and has held academic posts in Australian and overseas universities. He remains a member of the faculty, on leave of absence, of the School of Criminology at Simon Fraser University in British Columbia, Canada. He has been a member of the Australian Law Reform Commission and a consultant to Governments and other agencies on criminal violence both in Australia and North America. He was the Chairperson of the National Committee on Violence whose report "Violence — Directions for Australia" was published in 1990.

**JOHN AVERY**, AO, QPM, the recently-retired New South Wales Commissioner of Police. Mr Avery had a distinguished career both as a serving police officer and as a scholar. He brought to fulfilment in New South Wales the concept of community policing within the setting of an urban

society. His views are summed up in the final paragraph of his book "Police — Force or Service":

*"It is essential to an achievement of a satisfactory measure of social control in our society that people are aware of their own responsibilities and the futility of relying upon a hierarchical power structure to impose a democratically acceptable form of order ..."*

**DAVID BRUNT**, AM, the former Director of the Salvation Army Outreach Service in King's Cross, Sydney, and presently a member of the Offenders Review Board, New South Wales. Mr Brunt was awarded a Churchill Fellowship in 1984 to travel throughout Europe and study youth problems in the areas of homelessness, drug abuse and prostitution. In 1988 he was runner-up in the Bi-Centennial Pursuit of Excellence Award for Community Service in Australia. In 1989 both David Brunt and his wife Doreen were honoured with the award of Membership of the Order of Australia (AM) for their work in the community.
