So far, 21 contingents from Au-stralian police forces have helped keep the peace between Greek and Turkish residents there under the United Nations flag. The now small UNCIVPOL force

is all that remains of a once-large adjunct to the UN military forces of the divided island.

Then, Australia, Austria, Den-mark, New Zealand and Sweden supplied police officers for the peace-keeping role. Now, only Au-stralia and Sweden maintain the commitment.

The task for members today is a continual patrolling of the demilita-rised zone separating Greek and Turkish-held areas and watching out for breaches of the peace. Much social work also is in-

volved, escorting people across the zone so that they can get to medical services and for other needs. But it's not all work. Over the

years successive contingents have worked hard to make their island life more comfortable. Working parties spend a lot of time impro-ving the HQ station and their living accommodation.

Sport is a must, both for recrea-
