Remember Danielle Woodward?

She was the Constable featured in the February edition of *Platypus* after successfully competing in women's kayak events in Wales and France.

Constable Woodward has recently returned from another trip, this time to America, where she achieved a substantial boost in her world ranking from number 15 to number seven.

Her colleagues in Southern Region held a raffle in a bid to relieve, in part, the financial burden facing Danielle as she battled to beat the best.

Before her most recent overseas trip, there was a short informal ceremony at Southern Region HQ, Melbourne, at which Assistant Commissioner Brian Bates presented Danielle with a cheque for \$400. "Danielle has much to be proud about, following her achievements in slalom kayak events," he said.

"I hope you return a winner — which you will do, win, lose or draw, merely by the fact that you've already achieved so much and reached such a high place in world rankings.

"The important thing is, not only have you and your family every right to be proud, but the AFP can be proud as well, because it's not often we have in our midst somebody with a world ranking in sport to their credit."

Danielle competed on Savage River, Marylands, near Washington D.C., in the pre-World Championships. The formal championship events will be held at the same venue in June next year. This year's competition was identical to the Championships and gives the athletes a chance to "get to know" the venue.

Danielle is not sponsored, although on one previous occasion she did receive some support from the Wollongong Lions Club. To pay for her overseas trips to achieve her world ranking, she has had to find the money from her own finances, with help from her parents. So apart from keeping fit by training both in her boat and by riding a bike, Danielle also has to keep a close watch on her budget and save furiously to fund her overseas trips.
