
The commissioner was elected unanimously as delegate for Asia on the Executive Committee of Interpol at its 66th General Assembly in New Delhi in October.

Mr Palmer was attending the meeting as the Australian representative to the organisation and was accompanied by Queensland Police Service Commissioner Jim O'Sullivan, Director International Federal Agent David Schramm and Senior Liaison Officer Islamabad Federal Agent Charles Kemp.

He will serve as a member of a committee of 13 for a period of three years. The Executive Committee meets outside of the General Assembly three times a year.

Commissioner Palmer said he believes Interpol will play an increasing role in the fight against international crime and will be extremely important in the lead up to and in the conduct of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. He noted that during the present General Assembly it was agreed to upgrade the international names-of-interest index of Interpol.

The election of Mr Palmer recognises the standing of Australian police, particularly the Australian Federal Police, within the international community.
