

In 1956 he received the American Society of International Law's Award for his work: Legal Controls of International Conflict. In 1985 he became the first person ever to receive that award for the second time in recognition of Visions of World Order.

Professor Stone never retired. Although in 1972 he had to relinquish his Chair at the University of Sydney by virtue of reaching the age of 65, he immediately took up a visiting professorship at the University of NSW, which he held until the day he died. He also held a visiting Chair at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and each year spent part of his time in California to fulfill his obligation as Distinguished Professor of Jurisprudence at the University of California, Hastings College of Law. In the past few years, despite suffering from a terminal illness, he still kept on working. His last comment on public affairs by way of a letter to The Sydney Morning Herald appeared the day before he died.

He was the foundation President of the Australian Branch. Upon the death of our previous Patron, Sir Percy Spender, he was invited to become our Patron. This invitation he graciously accepted. We are very proud and grateful to have had him amongst us.

AUSTRALIAN ELECTED TO INSTITUT DE DROIT INTERNATIONAL

Professor James Crawford formerly of the University of Adelaide and now Challis Professor of International Law of the University of Sydney was elected as an Associe of the Institut de Droit International at its Helsinki session in August 1985. Professor Crawford was appointed to the Challis Chair upon the retirement of Emeritus Professor D.H.N. Johnson, a distinguished international lawyer who was formerly Professor of International and Air Law at the London School of Economics in the University of London. The Institut consists of 132 members and associates. Professor Crawford is the fourth Australian international lawyer to be elected to the Institut, the others were: Sir Kenneth Bailey (1947); Professor Julius Stone (1957); Professor D.P. O'Connell (1967).
