## **Preface**

This is the first volume of the Australian Year Book of International Law.

As the title page shows, its purpose is to present an annual survey of current problems of public and private international law, together with a digest of Australian practice in the field of public international law during the preceding twelve months.

That such an annual survey should at last make an appearance is a measure of the increasing interest in both subjects exhibited by Australian practitioners and scholars.

The modest aim of the publishers and of the editor is, above all, to be informative, and thereby to contribute to the extension of the world rule of law.
