Citizenship reforms passed by parliament



A change to the Citizenship Act that will allow Australians to acquire dual citizenship has been passed by the federal parliament. The reform, supported by the government and the opposition, will allow Australian citizens to acquire the citizenship of another country without losing their Australian citizenship. It is part of various amendments aimed at updating Australia's citizenship law. (Full story page 6)

House approves anti-terrorism bills



Five proposed laws aimed at combating terrorism have been passed by the House of Representatives. The bills, brought on as part of the response to the September 11 attacks on the United States, make terrorism a specific crime punishable by life imprisonment. The opposition has indicated that it wants more scrutiny of the legislation in the Senate. (See related story page 11)

- Industry and Resources;
- Legal and Constitutional Affairs;
- · Science and Innovation; and
- · Transport and Regional Services.
