Degree in Business (Land Administration)

The NT Property Services Industry Group have been working towards the introduction of an academic degree course at the NTU which is intended to form the basis of a comprehensive education in land administration.

The stream has been endorsed by the Faculty of Business at the NTU and the Property Services Industry Group now finds it necessary to convince the NTU that such a degree would attract sufficient interest to consider introducing it into the faculty's degree offerings.

It is envisaged that the degree would be of interest to a wide range of people including land economists, propert conveyancers, local government officers, Aboriginal land council staff with associated interest coming from the industry fields of conservation, law, finance/banking and building.

As well as offering core units studied by all Bachelor of Business students, the degree would include general land management units, (frequently law-based) and a number of stream specific units including land economics, valuations, planning and environmental law, local and regional planning and legal issues for land managers.

The course will, when fully developed, satisfy the national professional membership requirements of the Australian Institute of Conveyancers, the Australian Valuation and Land Economist Institute, the Real Estate Institute and/or the Australian Property Council.

The NT Property Industry Group considers the course to be of interest to the legal profession and has provided a flyer and questionnaire which supply information about the proposed degree and aim to identify the number of potential students.
