# **B**usiness Law Scholarship

## **Applications and nominations are now being called for the 1998 Business Law Scholarship.**

An initiative of the Business Law Section of the Law Council, the Scholarship is offered bi-annually. It is intended to assist successful applicants in undertaking post-graduate study at an appropriate Australian or overseas institution, probably, but not necessarily in the area of law. A full-time course of study is preferred.

Applicants for the Scholarship must be students enrolled in a course which entitles graduates to be admitted as practising lawyers in Australia, or applicants must have graduated from such a program within

three years prior to 27 February 1998. Alternatively, applicants must have been financial members of the Business Law section for two years prior to 27 February 1998.

The successful applicant will be expected to liaise with a suitable supervisor during the Fellowship, and to provide a written report to the Business Law Section Executive within three months of concluding study.

Up to \$12,000 is made available to the successful applicant.

The 1996 recipient of the Business Law Fellowship used the Fellowship to support her study for a Masters degree at Harvard Law School.

Siew Luan Low – ranked first in her graduating class for a Bachelor of Laws degree (first class honours) and Bachelor of Commerce degree from the University of Western Australia in 1993 – has been studying US income tax law and international taxation law as part of her degree at Harvard.
