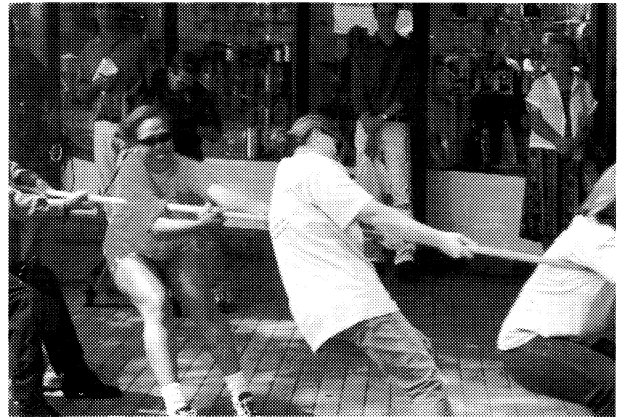


LAW WEEK 2000

Law Society President Mr Jon Tippett and the local Darwin media were present for the launch of Law Week 2000 by Attorney General Mr Denis Burke.



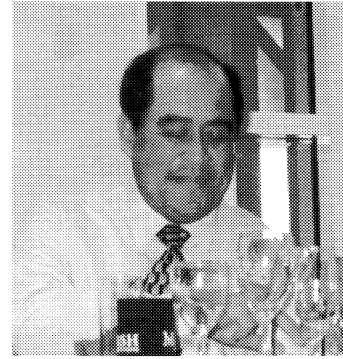
Law Society Vice President Mr Ian Morris joined Ms Nardine Collier and other practitioners in Alice Springs for the Law Week lunch.

LAWASIA President Mr Mervyn Encanto joined the Society for lunch.



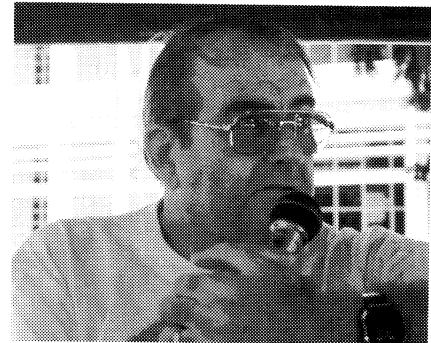
Over seventy high school students from Darwin attended the Law Careers Expo at the Supreme Court where practitioners in law spoke to them about their career options.



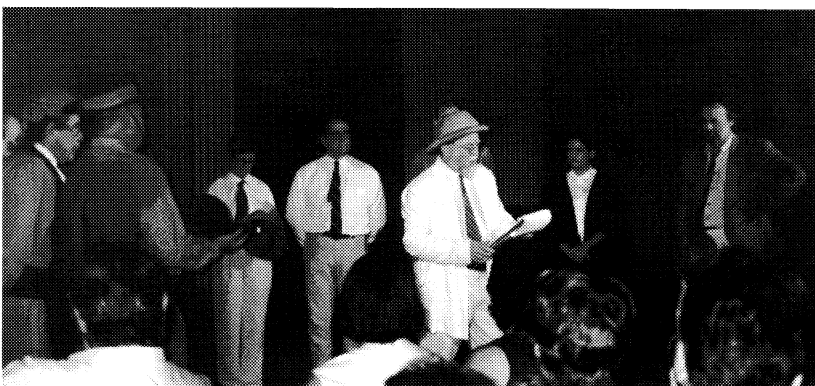
Participants on the Case by Case Crime Tour climbed aboard the Tour Tub for the hour and a half long tour. The tours were completely booked out.
