Aristotle: "It is the nature of chickens to cross the road."

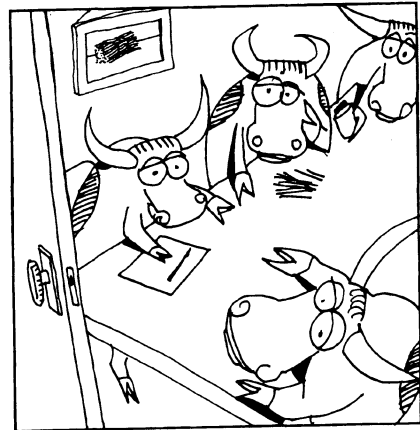
Karl Marx: "It was an historical inevitability."
