We also discussed the AYLC aspiration to create a national employment survey of conditions and awards experienced by young lawyers. To this end the AYLC wishes to encourage all the associations and their members to participate in the gathering of this information.

Upon receipt of the state and territory surveys, the AYLC intends to collate the results and provide a national survey, which will be made available to all members.


Accordingly, the NTYL committee will attempt to organise the provision of a Territory survey this year.
