school and college students) to gain work experience at an interstate law firm for a two week period. The idea for the scholarship came about from a youth participant who provided feedback that he/she would like more 'information to be a sports lawyer' (rugby, football, etc.). By connecting participating youth recipients of the scholarship to specialised areas of law and in different contexts in a big city there will be opportunities to be exposed to different learning environments and to refine interests. Support is requested from interstate law firms who can arrange a billet, and/or provide a suitable legal workplace environment as work experience, raise funds to cover travel costs and/or mentor a participant. Practitioners with connections to interstate law firms are encouraged to share this idea and help identify connections and supports.
