WILLIAM D. THORN, of Griffith, ACT, has recently been appointed Assistant Director-General, Social Sciences and Humanities, of the National Library of Australia. Mr Thorn was previously Director of the Library's Social Sciences branch, known as the Australian National Social Sciences Library. This new appointment brings the number of Assistant Directors-General of the Library to three, the others being Mr Bryan Yates, who is Assistant Director-General, Science and Technology, and Mr Arthur Ellis, Assistant Director-General, Networks and Co-ordination.

Carol was the recipient of the 1978-79 James Cook Bicentenary Scholarship, offered by Blackwells. Miss Woolcock joined the ANU Library staff soon after its inception when the collections and staff, under the direction of A.L.G. McDon.ald, were housed at Wyselaskie Hall, University of Melbourne. She moved to Canberra with the Library in 1951, and has served in senior cataloguing positions ever since.

Her contribution to the Library has been a very substantial one, since she was largely responsible for the initial establishment of the Library's cataloguing policies, and has kept close vigil on cataloguing standards over many years, as well as training many cataloguers. Her services to the profession included serving as a Representative Councillor on the LAA General Council in 1955.

New info science journal

A NEW scholarly journal *Social Science Information Studies* is to begin publication this year. Published by Butterworths, it will act as a focus and a forum for the inter-disciplinary field of information science and the social sciences.

The new journal will attempt to link social scientists in fields such as economics, politics, sociology, management, public administration, education and social psychology with practitioners, researchers and teachers in information science.

The Editor, Dr T.D. Wilson, and Associate Editor, Mr N. Roberts, are on the staff of the Postgraduate School of Librarianship and Information Science, University of Sheffield, England.

The Australian representative on the Editorial Board is Mike Ramsden, Lecturer, Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology. The subscription rates for the journal are: individuals £12.50 a year (four issues), institutions £30.00 a year.
