The mentally ill

Mrs Sherman was outlining some of the problems associated with mental illness as part of a campaign to develop community awareness in the International Year of the Disabled.

She stresses that the image of a mentally ill person as someone associated with violence locked up in an institution is incorrect. Many people who have mental or emotional breakdowns completely recover and pick up the threads of their lives very quickly.

July, nominated as mental health month, will feature a number of projects and programs to promote a better understanding of mental illness and mental health. It is hoped that libraries and bookshops will mount special displays of literature about mental illness during the month of July.
