

Obituary

ANY MEMBERS of the Association, especially former colleagues from the State Library of NSW and from special libraries, will have been saddened to hear of the death on 3 July 1981, of Mrs Constance McKay.

After graduating from the University of Sydney, Mrs McKay worked at the then Public Library of NSW, mainly under Miss N. Kibble in the Research Department, until her marriage. After a break she returned to librarianship in 1941 as Librarian at Commonwealth Industrial Gases Ltd and remained their librarian until her retirement in 1967. She was a skilled spokeswoman for industrial libraries and published many articles in the industrial press about their services.

Mrs McKay was active in the affairs of the Association all her professional life. She was a member of the first Special Libraries' Committee set up under the chairmanship of Miss Edith Sims in 1942/43 and was chairman of the Special Libraries Committee set up by the NSW Branch in 1944/45. She became the first President of the Special Libraries Section when it was created by the Association in 1953 and served the Section in many offices, including that of General Councillor, over many years.

She was also an active member of the NSW Branch, and was Vice-President in 1948/49 and President in 1949/50.

After her retirement from CIG, she continued her work in librarianship for some years with the Linnaean Society of NSW.

Special librarianship in Australia owes much to Mrs McKay - for her pioneering work in training other special librarians and in publicising the work of industrial special libraries, and for her long and dedicated service Jean M. Murray to the professional body.

Restricted publications

A delegation from the Branch and the Library Council of Victoria met with officers of the Attorney-General's Department in July to discuss the Police Offences Act as it relates to the handling of restricted publications in libraries. This is of particular concern to the LAA because certain works which could usefully be displayed in libraries (such as More Joy of Sex) are now being made restricted publications.

Branch Council's previous opinion that it would be impracticable to have libraries exempted from the Act completely was reinforced as a result of the meeting. The present Board members appear to interpret the guidelines in a fairly liberal manner but the danger is that the guidelines could result in a restriction of almost any publication dealing with material of a sexual nature. Branch Council has agreed to pursue the problems faced by libraries and to request a review of the restrictions on particular publications as appropriate. Any comments on the current guidelines or on particular titles which should be reviewed should be sent to Carmen Hannaker at Moonee Valley Regional Library.

Public Library funding

A Branch delegation met with the Victorian Minister for the Arts concerning funding for public libraries. Present prospects of an increase in funding appear slight. In fact, it looks as if libraries may have to fight to maintain their present level of State Government
