Looking ahead and assessing skills

A REPORT ENTITLED *Towards The Year 2000* has been prepared as a voluntary activity by the National Library's Innovative Technology Group, a body which brings together several members of the Library's staff who have a particular interest in technological development.

The report suggests how the National Library could be affected by possible future changes in the methods by which information could be stored, retrieved and disseminated. The aim of the Innovative Technology Group in preparing the report was to stimulate discussion among members of the Council of the National Library and among the Library's staff, which would assist the Library in planning its future.

The Council has not adopted the report, which remains the expression of the individual opinions of a group of members of staff. However, because of the understandable interest of the Australian library community, not only in the general topic of technological change but also in the possible effect of such changes on the National Library, the Council has agreed that an edited version of the re-

port be made available.
