Fantastic futures



Man's visions and dreams of the future is the theme of 'Fantastic Futures', a new major exhibition at the State Library of NSW.

Inspired by George Orwell's 1984, the display traces the imaginative, often extravagant, creations and inspirations of past inventors, writers and idealists from the Middle Ages to the 20th Century.

Rare books, engravings, maps, drawings, photographs and manuscripts from the Library's collections depict such fanciful inventions as a steam-heated, mediaeval bathhouse (conveniently portable!), Edison's anti-gravitational underclothing and th aeronaut Robertson's whimsical 1803 ver sion of a flying ship, complete with cannor anchor and a cockerel look-out! On the mor serious side is Charles Babbage's patent fo his Great Calculating Engine, forerunner c todays computers.

Among Sydney proposals on display is th architect's wash drawing of 'Australia facing the dawn', a 230' high monumen planned for erection on Fort Denison t commemorate Federation.

AGPS Deposit Libraries

THE AGPS Liaison Committee is reviewing the objectives and guidelines for the operation of the deposit scheme for Commonwealth publications. At present all States, the Northern Territory, and university libraries take part in the scheme. The lack of clarity in the eyes of some university libraries prompted this review, together with the requests from some libraries to debit the lesser-used materials. Responses from these libraries and interested organisations will be considered at the next meeting of the committee in October.

Consideration is also being given to extending the scheme to Parliamentary libraries.

At the same time, the committee is attempting to survey the use of deposit ma-terial in three State libraries (South

COMTAP'81 Proceedings

COMTAP '81 - the second joint international symposium on data communications technology and practice - was held in Sydney in November 1981 and was sponsored by the Australian Computer Society and the International Federation for Information Processing.

Australia, Tasmania and Victoria) and tw universities (Griffith and La Trobe). Th committee acknowledges the difficulty is measuring use, particularly from open ac cess collections, but believes, nevertheless that it has a responsibility to assess the e fectiveness of the scheme. The survey will look at use in 4 categories - Legislatior Parliamentary publications, Gazettes an Departmental publications.

AGPS Catalogues

Attempts have been made to link AGPS rec ords with the machine-readable records c the National Library. However, the two sys tems proved incompatible.

Freedom of Information

The new Commonwealth legislation has le to a steady stream of new publications mainly statements and manuals. AGPS est mates that another 900 publications a yea will result from FOI. With the change being introduced by the Hawke Govern ment, a further expansion in publishing i expected. Victoria has passed similar legis lation and other States are also considering FOI. Libraries will need to examine th legislation and be prepared to assist in th facilitation of access to Government infor mation as well as holding some of the publ cations themselves.
