UCLS - NATIONAL

The national seminar on Collection Management in Academic Libraries at Surfers Paradise on 16-17 February provided a forum for the exchange of information and ideas on the development and implementation of effective collection management programmes in academic libraries. Particular attention was given to the problems of financial, space and staff restrictions.

Eric Wainwright, University Librarian, Adelaide, examined collection adequacy including the results of some recent endeavours to create a measurable collection planning device. The role of automated collection management techniques also came under discussion.

The need for a collection development policy has attracted much attention. John Horacek, Senior Selection Librariam, La Trobe University, argued formalised guidelines for collection development are both restrictive and prescriptive. Jo McLachlan, Resources Librarian, University of New South Wales, presented the case for a written collection development policy, describing work being undertaken at the University of New South Wales Library.

The problems associated with deselection and storage were addressed by Spencer Routh, Collections Development Librarian, University of Queenland, with particular reference to the use of past statistics to predict future use and to the importance of recognising the difficulties of researchers in unpopular areas. The responsibilities of major academic libraries in preserving material for historical and biographical research were also discussed.

Margaret Cameron, Chief Librarian, Deakin University, spoke on regional resources and regional co-operation in Victoria. Practical implications for collection management in the individual library were discussed and evaluated.

The technology of document delivery was dealt with by Peter Judge, Officer-in-Charge, CILES, CSIRO. Technology present & future to facilitate the storage and transmission of documents and their delivery was discussed

The problems of collection development in a multicampus operation were explored by Brian Cook, Head, Resource Centre, Brisbane CAE.

Budget management for collection development has become increasingly difficult with educational cutbacks. Derek Fielding, University Librarian, Queensland, addressed some of the political and educational considerations for a large academic library.

The excellent papers presented were complemented by poolside lunches, a boat cruise sponsored by James Bennett Group and D.A. Book (Aust) Pty. Ltd. and a delightful dinner at Fisherman's Wharf. The proceedings are to be published and will be advertised in *InCite*.
