# Swinburne's Film and TV Department

The Film and Television Department at Swinburne runs two courses — a 3-year diploma taking approximately 16 students and a graduate diploma of one year's full-time study. The undergraduate course aims to provide professional training in both film and television production. The graduate diploma is aimed at graduates who want to make objective use of production skills in their area of expertise. This course takes approximately 24 students a year who specialize in film, video or animation production.

Notable graduates from the past include Gillian Armstrong, director of 'My Brilliant Career', and Richard Lowenstein, a 1979 graduate who won the 1980 Erwin Rado Award for his social documentary 'Evictions', and has recently had success internationally with his full-length feature 'Strikebound'. Other Melbourne Film Festival successes include the 'Grand Prix' for 'Shadows' by Royden Irvine and 'Tennis Elbow' by John Thompson.

The Australian Film Commission has chosen three 1983 films for inclusion in a series of overseas film festivals: Kathy Mueller's 'Every Day Every Night', Peter Jordan's 'Iwana Station' and Jo Bogdanov's 'Private and Confidential'. In animation, 1978 graduate Dennis Tupicoff's 'Dance of Death' won three major awards in 1983 — a first prize in the Australian Film Awards, a first at Arnecy in France, and a second prize at Krakow in Poland. Two

other animation students, Sally Prior and Andrew Quinn (whose computer animation has been seen in the logo for Channel 2's 'Countdown'), were invited to join the team of one of the top computer animation companies in America immediately after graduation.

Swinburne film and video productions have recently become available for purchase. All prints, and details of purchase, exhibition and distribution are handled by the Australian Film Institute (AFI) and enquiries should be directed to them. The AFI administers a nonprofit, self-funding scheme in which income from Swinburne programs is re-invested in more Swinburne work.

Until recently, master material for Swinburne productions was held at Swinburne. Agreement was reached with the National Film Archive (now the National Film and Sound Archive) for this material to be acquired by them. In early 1984 the backlog of materials held was transferred to the Archive, and arrangements made for current and future material to be incorporated one year after its release at Swinburne.
