ASCIS List available in volume form

The ASCIS Subject Headings List is to be published, for the first time, later this month. Prepared by D. W. Thorpe for the Australian Schools Cataloguing Information Service (ASCIS), the volume runs to 1032 pages, 240mm×185mm, hard cover, with a recommended retail price of \$45.

Publication of this work represents the first national subject headings list specifically prepared for Australia. It is the result of a successful trial last year by ASCIS which was formed in 1983 by the state and independent education systems of the six states and two cerritories to rationalise the massive duplication of effort involved in cataloguing by Australia's 10,000 schools.

Though primarily of interest to school liorarians, institutional and other librarians should welcome the availability of the listing in a permanent and familiar format.

New children's publishing house

Walter and Lois McVitty are the principals of a new publishing house specialising in Australian children's literature.

Walter McVitty is well known throughout the children's book world. Formerly Senior Lecturer at Melbourne College of Advanced Education, he taught classes in children's literature from 1969 to 1983. He has addressed conferences and seminars Australia-wide, and has written countless thousands of words on the subject of children's literature and reading for numerous professional journals in Australia and overseas. He has served as a judge in the Book Design Awards of the Australian Book Publishers Association and of the Book of the Year Awards of the Children's Book Council of Australia.

Lois McVitty, a distinguished secondary school librarian, is a former President of the Children's Book Council of Australia (Victorian Branch) and Chairman of the Judging Panel for the Book of the Year Awards.

The first title to be published under the Walter McVitty Books imprint (now available) is Melbourne author John Pinkney's *The Key and the Fountain*. Illustrated by Sandra Laroche, it is for children of 9–10 upwards.

Walter McVitty Books are distributed by Kingfisher Books (Vic.), Tower Books (NSW/ACT), Aaron Books (SA/NT), Herron Books (Queensland), Pickwick Books (WA) and Book Agencies of Tasmania.
