General: CSIRO Central Library acts as the co-ordinating centre for the CSIRO Library Network, which comprises 45 libraries throughout Australia and a further 35 outlying stations with library collections that are serviced by the professionally-staffed libraries.

CSIRO has had a co-operatively produced Catalogue of all its collections since the 1920's. This was in card form only until mid-1977, since when it has been supplemented by a computer produced microfiche catalogue. The in-house system is AUSMARC-compatible. Tenders for a fully interactive integrated library management system, of which the Union Catalogue will form the core, are currently being evaluated. CSIRO has recently been accorded as a participant in ARM. been accepted as a participant in ABN.

Miss J A Conochie, whose duties have included those of Chief Cataloguer will be retiring later this year. The Organization now wishes to appoint a Chief Cataloguer as her successor.

It is hoped that the successful candidate can take up these duties in mid-May or early June to ensure some overlap with the present incumbent.

Duties: To be responsible for the standards, oversight and maintenance of the CSIRO Union Catalogue. To monitor national and international developments in cataloguing theory and practice and to liaise with the National Library and Divisional libraries. To be responsible for the conduct of the Bibliographical Services Section of Central Library.

Qualifications and Experience: A recognised degree or equivalent qualifications, preferably in science, together with eligibility for professional membership of the Library Association of Australia. Considerable cataloguing experience, and demonstrated ability to organise and to lead in an environment of co-operation are essential. Further desirable attributes would be: computer-based cataloguing experience; experience with ABN; ability to catalogue Cryllic material; extensive experience in serials cataloguing.

Tenure: Indefinite with Australian Government superannuation benefits available.
