Open Library — The Extension Services Group was formed during 1984 to encourage the provision and promotion of library services to people unable to attend libraries or bookmobiles. Services in this category, such as those to the housebound or institutionalised, are sometimes looked on by Councils and Library Committees as inessential. One of the group's objectives is to underline the value of extension services to the community as equally important as the more traditional services.

Following Gus O'Donnell's recent retirement, writer Frank Moorhouse has become chairman of the Australian Copyright Council.

Frank Moorhouse brings to the council a wide range of experience in publishing, journalism and film. He has been active in author's rights issues for many years and instigated several landmark court cases in the field.

The council's founding chairman, Gus O'Donnell was one of the pioneers of Australian copyright. He established Copyright Agency Limited and was instrumental in setting up Aboriginal Artists Agency and the Copyright Society of Australia. He played a leading part in the campaign for photocopying fees for authors that led to the copyright amendments in 1980 and served as council chairman for 17 years.

STATE LIBRARY SELECTS URICA

The State Library of New South Wales is the latest of more than 20 libraries throughout Australia to select AWA's Urica library computer system.

The AWA Urica system, valued at about \$500,000, will be used to manage all the technical services, including serials control, cataloguing, monograph acquisition, stock control and information retrieval. The Australian system has already gained considerable international recognition, having been exported to the UK, United States and West Germany.

The State Librarian, Mr Russell Doust, said he was delighted that the library had chosen an Australian product after careful evaluation of a number of systems. 'I am confident that the Urica system will meet the needs of the library into the future,' he said. 'And I believe that it will make a significant improvement in the service the library can offer.'

The Urica system at the State library will interface with ABN, so that records can be exchanged in machine-readable form, either on tape or on-line.
