### News from the National Committee

The activities of the Committee for the last few months have centred around making plans for the Section's activities at the Darwin Conference. It was decided to sponsor an informal social evening at this conference, and arrangements have been made for a BBQ at the Darwin Sailing Club on the evening of Tuesday July 1.

A seminar 'Academic Libraries and the Information Market Place' has been organised for Sunday June 29. Speakers include Dr C. Chen (Simmons College, Boston), Mrs M. Broadbent (RMIT), Mr D. Schauder (Chisholm Institute of Technology) and Mr Colin Steele (ANU).

The Section's publication, *AARL*, reported an operating loss of nearly \$3000 in 1985; this deficit was covered by using accumulated reserves which have now diminished to only \$500. The Committee is discussing various ways to improve the financial viability of its publication; the situation in 1986 will be relieved to some extent by a subsidy from the LAA, based on current subscription levels.

The Committee is at the present time examining the provision of library resources concerning nursing education in tertiary
