The Australian Academy of Science and the Australian Academy of Techological Sciences operate a scientific and technological exchange programme funded by the Australian Department of Science. Scientists and technologists who are Australian residents and who are of at least post-doctoral or comparable status may apply to participate in the programme.

Applicants should propose a specific activity or a joint research project which has been developed in consultation with a host scientist in the UK. Proposals will be assessed on their scientific and/or technological merit. The host scientist or institution in the United Kingdom must be appropriate to the objective of the proposal, and the length of the visit must be suitable for conducting the proposed research. The expected outcome of the visit should be of value to Australian science.
