Electronic ordering

Initially on a trial basis, Queensland Institute of Technology is sending orders electronically to James Bennet Library Services.

They are using the Lynx database, Lion acquisition system and the downline loading software of IDAPS Australia.

Having searched the Lynx database for the required title and verifying the details, QIT orders electronically for the selected supplier.

James Bennett pick up the QIT orders from their electronic mail box and by loading them onto a diskette the orders can be entirely processed without the necessity for staff to verify or rekey.

The Albert Park Library in South Melbourne, Victoria has become the sixth Australian user of the Virginia Tech Library System (VTLS) and the seventieth user of the system worldwide. VTLS, a fully integrated local automation system, was officially installed at Albert Park in October, but had been operating there on a trial basis for several months.

Like other Australian public libraries using VTLS, Albert Park Library runs its systems on a machine it shares with the municipal government. The library has approximately 30,000 bibliographic records, houses 80,000 items, and serves 6,000 patrons.

Other VTLS users in Australia include The University of New England, Capricornia Institute of Advanced Education, Darling Downs Institute of Advanced Education, Cumberland College of Health Services and Campbelltown Public Library.
