SOUTH AUSTRALIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE

STAFF EXCHANGE SCHEME

(Approved Guidelines 3/10/1985)

Flinders University of South Australia, SA College of Advanced Education, SA Institute of Technology, State Library, University of Adelaide and TAFE have agreed to participate in an exchange scheme for library staff in South Australia commencing in 1986.

Aim: The scheme is seen as an important staff development initiative that will provide library staff from the above organisations with an opportunity to gain experience in another library in South Australia. Applicants will have the opportunity to further develop current interests and expertise, or to extend their experience into areas not presently available to them.

General conditions are:

- The normal period of an exchange will be 3-12 months. Exchanges need not involve concurrent exchange but must be completed within a period agreed by the two institutions.
- Intending applicants for an exchange must discuss their plans with their Chief Librarians and obtain approval in principle before submitting a proposal to the Co-ordinating Committee referred to below.
- Library staff placed on exchange will formally be on secondment to the host institution and will continue to receive their pay and other benefits of their employment from their home library but will work under the direction of the Chief Librarian or nominated officer of the host institution. Accruals of leave, seniority and other entitlements will continue as if the employee was located in his or her home institution. Some special arrangements may have to be negotiated where conditions of service vary markedly (e.g. TAFE leave) or where overtime or penalty rate payments are likely to apply. Other expenses of employment, such as travel, will be the responsibility of the employees concerned.
- Exchange placements will normally be made between staff of approximately the same level of classification.
- Within four weeks of the completion of an exchange the staff members involved will be required to evaluate their exchange experience on a prescribed form and submit it to the Co-ordinating Committee.
- Within four weeks of the completion of an exchange the Chief Librarian or nominated officer of the host institutions will also provide written evaluation of the exchange to the Co-ordinating Committee.
- 7. There shall be a Co-ordinating Committee responsible to SALAC and appointed by SALAC from nominees of each of the participating libraries or authorities or from organisations representing participating libraries. The Co-ordinating Committee shall receive applications for exchanges, refer the applications to appropiate institutions or authorities and monitor the operation of the scheme.
- 8. Any particular exchange proposal by the Co-ordinating Committee does not constitute an authority for the exchange to proceed. The Committee will only deal with proposals that have been approved by the Chief Librarian and, if necessary, the Executive Officer of a home institution or authority. Every proposal must then receive the specific approval in writing of the Cheif Librarian or Executive Officer of both the home and host institutions or authorities before the exchange may proceed.
