

MORE ON THE GREAT MEMBERSHIP RACE

This is the second report on Branch membership and recruitment for 1986, and it shows that there has been quite a lot of activity since the end of April—but not all in the desired direction. The first report in InCite No 9 showed that the Northern Territory Branch was leading the field with a 12.5% increase in financial members from January to the end of April.

At 1 September the Branch had increased its lead to 18%, with the Queensland Branch second again (up 6%) and the Western Australian Branch still third (up 4.3%). Tasmania and the ACT, sad to say, were in the red with fewer financial members than at the start of the year. Perhaps it's the climate — or maybe the fringe benefits tax!

The figures need a few words of explanation. They are for financial personal and institutional members, and exclude 'voucher only' institutional members. They include members who have renewed for 1986, as well as new members. They are not all our members — we have another 167 loyal supporters overseas. Astute readers, and Branch recruitment officers keen to win the prizes being offered by General Council will note that some of the 'increases' are less than those shown in the earlier report. This is because members who had not paid 1986 fees were dropped to the ranks of the unfinancial at the end of May. 1298 members became unfinancial at this date. or 18.3% of the total membership, which is rather disappointing. Much of the good work being done by Branches in recruiting new members is being undermined by members not
