In its forty-nine years of existence, the Association has had only two names, firstly as the Australian Institute of Librarians, and since 1949 as the Library Association of Australia. Judging by that, there won't be another chance to have your say on this important decision for some time to come, so if you haven't replied yet do so immediately. Even if your

choice isn't the choice of the majority at least you will have expressed your opinion and, let's face it, there's a fifty percent chance that you'll be on the winning side!

Mrs E.B. Lyons, Principal Librarian of th Public Libraries Service, State Library Queensland and Ms Anna Raunik, former Ethnic Services Librarian at State Library Queensland also gave papers looking at th local situation and historical development of the State Library Collection.

It was pleasing to note the attendance of Ben Humphreys, Federal Member for Griffit Ann Warner, State ALP Member for Quilpi Tim Quinn, a local Alderman, and Dulci Turnbull representing the Lord Mayor of Bri bane. We hope to be enlisting their support for the campaign in the future.

Two resolutions were passed by the meeting one supporting the campaign in general terms and empowering the newly forme Working Group on Multi-cultural Library Se. vices (Qld) to follow up on much of the lobby ing. The second involved stepping up lobbyin for the appointment of an Ethnic Service Librarian in the State Library which was see as an important priority within Queensland.
