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Draft budget for 1988 IFLA Conference

This budget is provisional only until further detailed information is available, at which time further revisions will be required.

The expenditure items are based on 1985, and possibly 1986, prices with both a budget reserve and an allowance for inflationary increases built in to the budget.

It is not possible at this stage to estimate with accuracy the number of enrolments which this IFLA Conference will attract. For Australians in particular, there will be three options open:

- (1) enrolment for LAA 25th Biennial Conference August 27–30
- (2) enrolment for IFLA 54th General Conference August 30–September 3
- (3) enrolment for both Conferences.

For this reason Budget, No. (3) for the IFLA Conference has been designed for two groups — one, for 1200 enrolments and two, for 1700 enrolments.

Comments on some items:

INCOME

- (1) *Enrolments*: The enrolment fee has been included as A\$200 for both the budget for 1200 and the budget for 1700.
- The enrolment fee entitlement to include:
- (a) attendance at official opening
- (b) admission to all sessions
- (c) morning and afternoon teas
- (d) attendance at Conference reception
- (e) special bus transport, as required
- (f) set of papers.

The enrolment fee for accompanying persons has been increased from A\$140 to A\$150 for both budgets i.e. for either 200 accompanying persons or 300 accompanying persons.

The enrolment fee for accompanying persons to include:

- (a) attendance at official opening
- (b) attendance at Conference reception
- (c) attendance at one (or two) accompanying persons functions e.g. Harbour cruise, tour, luncheon.



(2) Late Fees: @ A\$50 each have been added — 400 for the 1200 enrolment budget, and 500 for the 1700 enrolment budget.

From the past performance of enrolments for IFLA conferences, it would seem that these figures might e the minimum number of late enrolments to be nticipated.

- (3) Exhibition: A\$10,000 this figure is based on alf of the anticipated income from the exhibition, the ther half to be allocated to the LAA Conference.
- (4) Sponsorship: A\$118,461 (for 1200 enrolments) nd A\$46,854 (for 1700 enrolments).

These figures are based on the amounts required om sponsorship to balance the budgets rather than stimates of the potential sponsorship from government and from industry.

Expenditure items for which income might be anticiated to be covered by sponsorship could include — Satchels — see Expenditure A\$7,620–A\$10,620 Printing — see Expenditure A\$57,000–A\$70,000 Bus Transport — see Expenditure A\$18,000–A\$20,000

Audio-Visual Facilities — see Expenditure A\$12,000

It is unlikely that the enrolment figures would be as w as 1200, but even with 1700 enrolments A\$46,854 a high figure for the amount of sponsorship required balance the budget for the IFLA Conference only, part from sponsorship required for the LAA conference.

XPENDITURE

(5) Hire Venues: A\$30,000, both for 1200 enrolments nd for 1700 enrolments. This remains a variable figre until the precise requirements are clarified.

It is based on one plenary session only — at the ydney Opera House, to follow the official opening, lus venues at the University of N.S.W.

The Concert Hall, S.O.H., hire for an afternoon is at resent A\$5,000, but current IFLA programme equirements would indicate that this venue would be equired now for one occasion only.

The University of N.S.W. hiring charges have hanged little since early 1983. Some venues are a title higher, and some lower, but there is to be a revision in January 1986, at which time the budget will equire further revision.

Overall, on 1985 hiring fees, the figure of A\$30,000 adequate.

(6) Printing: A\$57,000 (for 1200) and A\$70,000 (for 700). This figure is to include the cost of printing two reliminary announcements, the conference circular, ith enrolment forms (in French and English), the andbook (in French and English) and sets of papers n French and English), name badges, entree cards, fficial opening programme sheets, etc., in addition to istant print items such as list of participants.

The Conference circular and the handbook are varible figures at present. It is possible that these two

items may cover both the IFLA Conference and the LAA Conference, in which case the cost of printing for these items may be shared between the two Conferences.

The introduction of sets of papers to be provided for each member of the Conference is innovative — a "first" for an IFLA Conference. Allowance has been made for cost of, say, 120 papers of 8 pages each, to be printed in both English and French in a booklet A4 size format with cover.

(7) Postages/Couriers: A\$14,000 (for 1200) and A\$15,000 (for 1700). This is another item, the cost of which may be shared in part with the LAA Conference, providing that the Conference circular covers both the IFLA Conference and the LAA Conference.

The figure is to cover the cost of distribution of the preliminary announcements and conference circular, together with posting of receipts, accommodation confirmation, correspondence relating to enrolments and general correspondence, including the substantial costs of overseas airmail postages.

- (8) Stationery/Photocopying: A\$1,800 (for 1200) and A\$2,000 (for 1700). This item includes the cost of envelopes for mailing Conference circulars, etc. and for receipts and other general stationery items.
- (9) Telephone (S.T.D., I.S.D., & Cables): A\$3,500 (for 1200) and A\$4,000 (for 1700). In addition to general telephone expenses prior to the Conference, this item is to cover the costs of telephones at the venue for Conference registration and for the media.
- (10) Satchels: A\$7,620 (for 1200) and A\$10,620 (for 1700) for 1200+70 comps @ A\$6.00 each and for 1700+70 comps @ A\$6.00 each. (This is one certain item for sponsorship.)
- (11) Morning & Afternoon Teas: A\$11,801 (for 1200) and A\$16,201 (for 1700) to cover the cost of A\$2.20 per person for one morning tea and for one afternoon tea for 4 days, plus allowance for, say, 500 sundry morning teas or afternoon teas @ A\$1.25 each per pre or post IFLA meetings.
- (12) Conference Reception: A\$22,050 A\$31,050 for 1470 (1200 + 70 comps + 200 accompanying persons) @ A\$15 per person or 2070 (1700 + 70 comps + 300 accompanying persons) @ A\$15 per person.
- (13) IFLA liaison: A\$5,000 this is an amount to cover any extraneous or unanticipated expenses associated with IFLA liaison.
- (14) Audio-Visual Facilities: A\$12,000. The hire of venues at the University of N.S.W. includes the hire of audio-visual equipment, but not the cost of operations. However, it is likely that in addition some equipment may be required to be hired from off-campus.

This figure is variable until the requirements of the

speakers are known.

- (15) Bus Transport: A\$18,000 to A\$20,000. This is another variable figure until the requirements have been finalized. The cost is to include transport to and from the University of N.S.W. and the Sydney Opera House for the official opening, and possibly for transport daily to and from the University of N.S.W. and city accommodation venues.
- (16) Simultaneous Translation Equipment: A\$23,054 for hire of equipment for four languages a variable figure until the precise requirements are known.
- (17) Interpreters: A\$32,000, allowing for the cost of local interpreters for French/English translation and expenses for overseas interpreters for two other languages.
- (18) IFLA Officers and Staff: A\$6,000 as required for per diem for five persons.
- (19) Hire Office Equipment: A\$2,000 for equipment for IFLA staff at conference.
- (20) Insurance: A\$6,000, to cover the cost of 'disaster' insurance and public liability.
- (21) LAA Attendance at IFLA: A\$15,000 to cover the cost of attendance by LAA representatives at IFLA Conferences in 1984, 1985, 1986 and 1987.
- (22) LAA Committee Expenses: A\$15,000, to cover LAA expenses for attendance at IFLA Conference meetings in Australia.
- (23) Accompanying Persons Programme: A\$6,000 to A\$9,000. In addition to attending the

the cost for which has been included in these items above, allowance has been made for each accompanying person (200 for 1200 enrolments and 300 for 1700 enrolments) to attend one/two activities arranged for them at a total cost for each of A\$30. This may be a Harbour cruise, morning coffee and a tour of Sydney, or a tour to the South Coast or Blue Mountains, etc.

- (24) Organization & Secretariat: A\$50,000. N.B. This fee is for IFLA 54th Conference only the balance of the fee of \$98,500 to be allocated to the LAA 25th Biennial Conference.
- (25) Budget Reserve: A\$17,141 (for 1200) and A\$18,946 (for 1700). These amounts are 5% of the above expenditure items for each budget.

This item is to cover

- any items of expenditure not yet anticipated
- any reduction in the anticipated number of enrolments.

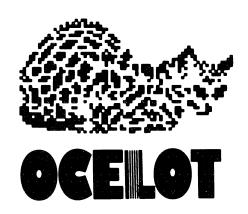
