Commonwealth Assistance for Public Libraries Campaign

Two important developments have recently occurred in the Commonwealth Assistance for Public Libraries Campaign.

Early this year, the Federal Government established a new committee to review Migrant and Multicultural Programs and Services. The Jupp Committee, as it is known, will advise the Government on:

- Principles and strategies which should guide the provision of programs and services into the future.
- The kinds of policies, programs and services required.
- The arrangements and means by which those programs and services could best be provided.

The committee is to report on Stage 1 of its review in June 1986 and on Stage 2 in mid 1987.

The National Co-ordinating Committee for the campaign has decided to send its Submission on Commonwealth Assistance to Multicultural Library Services to the Jupp Committee and will arrange for representatives to attend any hearings which the Jupp Committee might hold.

On February 16, 1986, representatives from both AACOBS and the LAA attended a meeting sponsored by the Federation of Ethnic Communities Councils of Australia (FECCA) to discuss its response to the National Language Policy Report, which is currently being considered by the Federal Department of Education. FECCA's submission to the Federal Government encompasses the recommendations contained in the LAA/AACOBS Submission on Commonwealth Assistance to Multicultural Library Services. Derek Whitehead from the CAPL National Co-ordinating Committee was also present in a FECCA delegation which visited a number of Ministers and Shadow Ministers to discuss the National Language Policy Report.

The Submission on Commonwealth Assistance to Multicultural Library Services is currently being printed and will be distributed shortly. A summary of the submission will be circulated in *InCite* and copies of the full document will be available to interested parties on request.
