

• Margaret Isaacs, formerly of Dandenong Valley Regional Library Service in Melbourne, nas been appointed Research Fellow at Monash University's Graduate School of Librarianship to carry out a study of the epresentation of Australian creative writing n Australian libraries.

The study was initiated by Prof Jean Whyte n response to the ongoing debate between publishers, authors, book trade people and ibrarians on the question of Australian content in libraries. The study funded by the Australian Research Grants Scheme and Monash University aims to establish the extent to which libraries collect Australian creative material and to examine what relaionship this might have to Australian creative writing and publishing. The study will include public, school and academic libraries throughout Australia.

Mr W.T. Cations has been appointed University Librarian of The Flinders University of South Australia. He will take up this position from 1 January 1988. Currently, Mr Cations is Deputy University Librarian at the University. Before becoming deputy he had been Institute Librarian at the Phillip Institute of Technology following earlier experience at Melbourne State College and the National Library of Australia.

Mr Cations has been involved in the LAA in a rariety of ways over the years. He is one of the wo Association representatives on the Ausralian Book Trade Committee and last year vas a founding member of the South Ausralian Group of the Acquisitions Section of he Association.

Available in September, he LAA member price is \$50 (plus \$3 postage) nd the non-member price is \$70 plus postage. DAD describes over 760 current Australian irectories, in all subject fields. The descripions are arranged alphabetically by title in ach of 30 subject categories - accommodaon, agriculture, arts, associations, business, uying guides, community information, and on. Each description includes name and ddress details of the publisher, bibliographic etail such as ISBN/ISSN, size, editor, availaility and price, and contains descriptions of ne scope, arrangement, entry detail, indexes, inguages used, and other data.

In addition to the comprehensive subject idex, which is based on the APAIS Thesau-18, DAD also includes indexes for publisher, ponsor, editor, ISBN, ISSN, and title. 
