Library support to nursing

Vicki Williamson, Senior Librarian at Armidale CAE, suggests people interested in the provision of library services to the health sciences and, in particular, to nursing students, will be interested in a short article which appeared in *Library Association Record*, 88(7), July 1986 p 314.

The article was titled 'Library provision for nursing students must be improved'. The article reviews concerns and actions of UK Health Services librarians, with particular reference to the projected changes in nurse education. All in all, very familiar ground for some Australian colleagues.

While the issues may be very familiar to some of us, it was refreshing to learn that our UK colleagues have already reached agreement on a number of important principles. One of the most important areas for agreement is relevant to the Australian situation: combining all library resources in a district under common management makes good sense in both service and economic terms.

Aus literature

Professor Jean P. Whyte of the Graduate School of Librarianship at Monash University has received a grant from the Australian Research Grants Scheme to study the collection of Australian creative writing in Australian libraries.

The aim of this project is to study acquisition of Australian creative writing. It will determine what proportion of material is acquired by libraries, at what cost, in which categories, for what reasons as well as the effect of this acquisition or non-acquisition on library users, Australian creative writing and Australian publishing.

The study will encompass public, school and tertiary libraries.
