Libraries in the subway

Adelaide librarian, Allison Gordon, has just returned from a 10-month Mortlock Fellowship tour of libraries in Scotland, America and Canada, where she studied library services for teenagers. Tales about libraries being built in subways and a public library protected by armed guards are two of the many sights she saw.

Allison discovered a number of libraries solely set up for teenagers. The major reason for these libraries, according to Allison, is that 'children basically have nowhere to go after school'. She said that libraries in Scotland were not only study centres but also important recreational outlets. In America, however, she was surprised to find the emphasis on study not recreation.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

In 1986 the General Council of the Library Association of Australia resolved to change the composition of the Executive Committee from President, immediate Past President, Vice President, General Secretary, General Treasurer and Chairman of the Board of Education, to President, immediate Past President, Vice President and two members of the Council elected by the General Council to the Executive Committee.

The position of General Treasurer and General Secretary are thus being abolished and this will be completed when revised By-laws are approved by the Governor General. In the interim these positions are being filled by the two members of the Council elected to the Executive Committee.

In accordance with Division F Regulations nominations are now called for the position of Vice-Pesident 1989 (President-elect 1990). Nominees must be financial members of the Association. Candidates and nominators should read the relevant regulations carefully.

Please note that nominations shall be:

- in writing
- signed by two financial members of the LAA

• accompanied by the written consent of the nominee, who shall supply a curriculum vitae and a statement of professional concerns (each of no more than 100 words).
