Following the appointment of Dr Christine Henderson as University Librarian in 1988, there have been several other appointments to senior positions at the University of New South Wales Library.



EDITH ALICE SIMS

Edith died suddenly on 1 November 1988, a few weeks before her 85th birth-

Educated at Fort Street Girls High School, she matriculated and passed the Public Service entrance examination in 1921. She joined the staff of the Public Library of New South Wales in 1922 and, after various qualifying examinations, was appointed Librarian of the New South Wales Department of Public Health in 1938. She held this office until 1942, very successfully organising this important specialist library.

From 1942 until 1950 Edith was Librarian of the Sydney Technical College. She was then transferred to the New South Wales Department of Technical and Further Education, and during this period (1951-63) was also Acting Librarian of the New South Wales University of Technology. After her retirement from the public service, she was Librarian of the United Services Institute, Sydney, for some years.

Edith was a foundation member of the Australian Institute of Librarians, present at the Inaugural Meeting in Canberra in 1937 and attending the 50th Anniversary Meeting there last September. She was a very active member of her profession, serving on many committees. In 1948 she received the British Council and Carnegie travel grants, which enabled her to study in libraries in the United Kingdom and the United

In her later years her great interest was in the preservation of the historic Gore Hill Cemetery. She was honorary archivist for the 'Friends of Gore Hill Cemetery', publishing a book Gore Hill Cemetery, 1868–1974 in 1985.

Edith Sims was a fine librarian, highly respected, loved by her staff, and a good friend.
