

ALIA looks ahead 500 years

The Australian Library and Information Association has become increasingly concerned with the massive preservation problems that libraries face. Through its Publications Board, it has been actively promoting the use of permanent paper or paper produced by using an alkaline process.

In support of its policy, the Association recently published *ALIAS: Australia's library, information and archives services, an encyclopaedia of practice and practitioners* edited by Harrison Bryan, on 95 gsm Perpetuum-Wove paper.

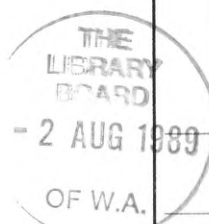
This paper is a stable and durable product produced from a minimum of 50 per cent cotton fibre with the remainder being well-purified wood fibre. It has a pH extract of more than 8.0 and is buffered against acidic material with a minimum content of calcium carbonate of 3 per cent. When artificially aged at 105°C according to the TAPPI Method T453 su-70, the paper retains at least 50 per cent of its original tearing strength after the equivalent of 500 years.

The encyclopaedia represents the first composite Australian perspective on the library and information science industry within Australia. It is a major investment by the Association in documenting this industry, and one that was only made possible by the generous financial support of Kilners Commercial Carriers Pty Ltd.

Recently Dr Neil Radford, Chairman of the Publications Board, presented Mrs Barbara Champion, the Chief Executive of Kilners, with an inscribed copy of *ALIAS* at a special function held at Kilners NSW headquarters.

ALIAS was launched earlier this year by the Honourable Mr Kevin Rizzoli, the Liberal Member for Hawkesbury and the Speaker of the NSW Legislative Assembly, at the Information Online '89 Conference.
