Library Focus Victoria Towards more effective cooperation

Library Focus Victoria has been founded by Technilib, CAVAL and the Victorian Branch of the Australian Library and Information Association to foster and provide a focus for coordination and cooperation between the libraries of Victoria.

Technilib, established in 1975, is the cooperative network and technical services centre serving an important group of Victorian public library systems, including the State Library of Victoria.

CAVAL, established in 1978, is the cooperative network agency linking all of the

State's academic libraries.

The Victorian Branch of the Australian Library and Information Association (formerly the Library Association of Australia) is the largest professional association of librarians and library technicians in the State.

Library Focus Victoria, founded in late 1990, brings together in a single location these organisations and other interlibrary activities. This is a significant step in the development of viable, coordinated and effective library services for the people of the State of Victoria.
