HE CONFERENCE OPENING Ceremony will be held in the Civic Centre, Albury Convention and Performing Arts Centre on Sunday, 26 September, at 4pm, and will feature a welcome from the Mayors of Albury and Wodonga prior to the Official Opening of the Conference by the Federal Minister for the Arts, Wendy Fatin, and the ALIA Presidential Address of Bev Kirby. This will be followed by a relaxing but civilised opening cocktail party for all delegates, at 6pm.


