Many of you will now have had the opportunity to hear Alison Crook, 1993 Qantas/Bulletin Business Woman of the Year, give her presentation 'Organisational Change for Client Focus' which have been held in Darwin, Townsville, Hobart, Adelaide, Brisbane and Canberra. Plans for presentations are now underway for Melbourne and Perth. It is not envisaged that we will plan to have Alison talk in NSW, as many of the NSW Librarians will have had plenty of opportunities to hear her speak already. - settling on the basic 'shape' of the program and calling for suggestions in New Zealand and Australia (three full days of 'interactive' conference proper, plus two days for special interest seminars and workshops).

After these first steps, the team will soon be *jogging!* In the next fourteen months you will be hearing much more about the plans for this large and exciting event.

The last Joint Conference was 11 years ago—the one after 1994 will not be before 2000. So make sure you're there in 1994.
