The idea that Australia should have its own Portrait Gallery was initiated by Gordon and Marilyn Darling, and this announcement is the culmination of the Darlings' five year campaign. Gordon Darling, previously Chairman of the National Gallery of Australia and a generous sponsor of the arts, together with his wife, was the driving force behind the touring exhibition 'Uncommon Australians—Towards a National Portrait Gallery'. Through its rich collection of documentary portraits, the National Library was the greatest institutional lender to this important touring exhibition.

to take responsibility for its operation.

The NLA will not be looking to build up a new collection but rather to utilise its own extensive holdings of Australian portraits, and to borrow from existing collections in institutions and in private hands. It will arrange three to four exhibitions a year at Old Parliament House, presenting works in a range of mediums to explore different ways of looking at Australians and the Australian experience. Oral history interviews and manuscripts will add variety and context to each exhibition, and from time to time these exhibitions will be included in the NLA's national touring program.
