

Helen Hayes has been appointed University Librarian of the University of Melbourne. Helen's association with the University Library goes back 20 years when she joined the Baillieu Library staff as a cataloguer. In 1977, she moved to the then Melbourne College of Advanced Education as Lending Services Librarian, and

worked in several positions before becoming Librarian for the College in 1988.

The following year she returned to the University Library as Associate Librarian (Reader Services) and when Denis Richardson retired in April 1991 she became Acting University Librarian. Helen has been deeply involved with the library profession and major national library bodies, and also active within the University community. She now has the challenge of taking this Library into the 21st century, with the emphasis in the first instance being given to accommodation needs.

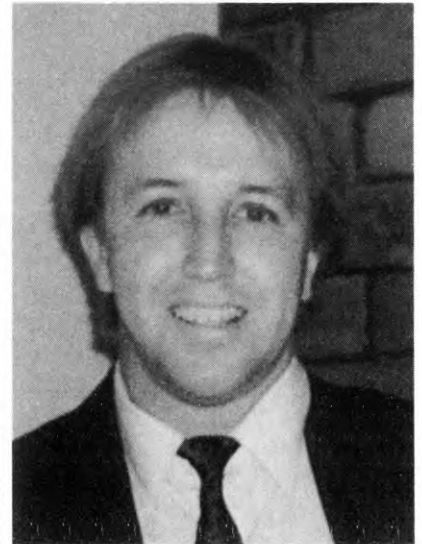
