Assessment through the National Training Reform Agenda may point to the need for reskilling but our own awareness of the changing concepts and technological development in library and information services direct us to be proactive in planning our own professional development for 1994.

The opportunities are diverse and numerous:

- formal courses are offered by the education institutions for those who wish to undertake postgraduate and higher degrees;
- conferences are organised by ALIA and the sections—in 1994, the Joint ALIA-NZLIA Conference in New Zealand, and all the Public Libraries Conference in Melbourne in February;
- short courses and workshops are offered by the education institutions, commercial training providers and by ALIA divisions;
- self-education courses are available from ALIA for those who wish to train independently and at their own pace.
