Sexual health brochures available on audio tape

ineteen brochures on AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases are available on cassette from the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind (RVIB) Talking Book Library.

These brochures were previously available only in print form.

Doctors, community health centres, schools, family planning clinics, public libraries, AIDS organisations and hospitals lend the

tapes to people with print disabilities who use their services. This group includes people who have vision impairments, physical impairments and learning disabilities.

The brochures include information about AIDS and safe sex and the handling of needles and syringes. Nine of the brochures also relate to a range of sexually transmitted diseases.

In a project initially coordinated by the National Federation of Blind Citizens and funded by the Victorian Department of Health and Community Services AIDS/STD unit, copies of the tapes were made available free-of-charge from the State Library of Victoria, the Braille and Talking Book Library and the RVIB Talking Book Library.


