ow many cataloguing standards committees do you think Australian libraries need? Do you know how many committees there are and what they do?

The major national committees are the Australian Committee on Cataloguing (ACOC) and the ABN Standards Committee. ACOC has an international focus and represents Australia on AACR2 revision and Dewey. The ABN Standards Committee recommends on how these international standards are used in ABN. A recent newcomer to the library standards arena is Committee IT/19 of the Standards Association of Australia. This committee works on international standards in the information technology field and recommends the 'cloning' of these standards to become Australian standards. A recent example is the Z39.50 search and retrieve standard.


A committee has been established
