9th National Library Technicians Conference, 24–26 September 1997

he keynote address for the opening day of the 9th National Library Technicians Conference is being given by Mr Warren Horton, director general, National Library of Australia. Warren has been director general of the National Library of Australia since 1985.

He started life in libraries in 1957 in the State Library of New South Wales, wrapping newspapers, entering serials in kalamazoos and retrieving stack items. After two years in the New South Wales Department of Public Works Library he then spent over fifteen years in various information service jobs in the State Library, including the Mitchell Library from 1966–1973. He moved to Victoria as state librarian in 1981, and to Canberra four years later. He is proud to still be able to tie a library knot, having tied many in his early career.

Warren lectured part-time in Sydney for many years, first for students in the Registration Examinations of the then Library Association of Australia and for much of the 1970s in the technician level course at Sydney Technical College. He had much to do with the introduction of the technician qualification in Australian librarianship, including the negotiations for the Sheldon Award in New South Wales in 1973. This placed technicians into the State Library and the New South Wales Department of Technical Education employment structure and flowed on into other awards.

He has been a member of the ALIA Library Technician Sec-

tion since its establishment, and was pleased to participate in the early national technician conferences.

Colour by day and night is the theme for Floriades tenth birthday celebration. Floriade is Canberra's annual salute to spring held in Commonwealth Park this year from 20 September to 19 October 1997: an imaginative and innovative horticultural display accentuated by community arts projects and a dazzling night-time lighting scheme.

Displays will include a 400-metre long floral river, Australian garden, floating birthday cake, quirky gardens, hanging gardens and the floriade village, poles of light, and a secret garden. Floriade also includes sculpture, music, art, dancing, drama and fun! Commonwealth Park is in close proximity to the Convention Centre, the venue for the conference, and we hope that delegates will take advantage of this and enjoy Canberra's spring festival.
