Information Access Group Lisa Belkin, CSIRO

The Information Access Group was formed in 1992 to help select a replacement OPAC and to consider datasets other than the traditional catalogue data for access throughout CSIRO. Dr Colin Ward, former deputy chief, CSIRO Division of Biomolecular Engineering writes of the Information Access Group:

Richard Holt, Port Phillip Library Service

As the first public library in service in Australia to be subjected to competitive tendering, Port Phillip's image within the community in the immediate post-competitive tendering phase was not a positive one. Community fears of reduced service levels were allayed in part by the technological innovations which were introduced in the first year of the contract. The Port Phillip Library Service home page offers a number of features that are distinctive, namely:

- guides and signposts such features as the on-line Internet tutorial designed by Richard, to alert parents about ethical issues and with clear search tips;
- · commitment to library users;
- publicity for local events.

The page is a model of innovation and excellence, delivering the highest quality in content design and currency of information.

Parliament of Victoria on the Internet Jon Breukel, Parliamentary Library

The aim of the VicHansard database is to enable Victorians, and in particular, those who are heavily-reliant on parliamentary information, to be able to search through the entire full-text of the Victorian parliamentary debates for any words or phrases which any member of parliament has said either in the Legislative Assembly or Legislative Council from 1991 to the present. In designing the system Jon was aware of the need to be able to search across the major parliamentary procedures and therefore designed the system specifically with the aim of enabling users to search directly under ten major parliamentary activities. The format is as simple as possible and the powerful Titan/ Express software has meant that enquiries are executed very quickly.

Headstart program

Nola Smolders, John Paul College in Frankston The aim of the Headstart program is to give selected post-Year 10 students, who are at risk of not coping with and/or completing the VCE because of a lack of research and organisational skills, a Headstart by having them undertake an intensive three day course on Research and Organisational Skills so that they would feel confident and supported to undertake research in their Year 11 studies. For three days the students worked closely with the project staff, brainstorming, listening, watching, experimenting, trying, achieving. In very small groups and with much support they searched the catalogue, the Internet, newspaper and periodical indexes, both print and electronic. They watched and searched, were helped immediately they needed it, learnt to take notes, created bibliographies, drafted and processed their reports. Then finally came the support staff conference with them, sharing results and evaluating the program.
