Its responsibilities involve a public lecture and discussions across various departments of the University on the subject of the occupant's research.

During his stay at the University of Illinois, Professor Rayward will be continuing his research into the development of formal information infrastructure as an aspect of social organisation in early modern England and Europe. He is examining the differentiation and institutionalisation of information functions in the Republic of Letters and the emergence of museums, archives and the prototype of modern library in the 17th and early 18th century.

Professor Rayward will also take a doctoral seminar in the Graduate School of Library and Information Science in which he will be located during the period of his professorship. He begins his period of leave by giving a paper at the Joint World Conference on Educational Multimedia and Educational Telecommunication in Calgary in Canada on 'The idea of the world brain: some millenarian schemes for knowledge organisation in the 17th and 20th centuries'. Boyd will be returning to the University of New South Wales at the end of 1998.

Dr Connie Wilson has taken the position of Visiting Professor in the College of Information Science and Technology at Drexel University in session two this year. She will be participating in on-going research activities of the School and working with Dr Howard White and Dr Katherine McCain in the area of citation analysis. She will be consulting with Dr Henry Small and associates at the Institute for Scientific Information and participating in the general research activities of the Institute. Connie will also be presenting a paper at the Sixth International Conference of the International Society for Scientometrics (ISSI): 'Defining subject collections for informetric analyses: the effect of varying the subject aboutness level'.
