## National section re-forms

ntil the late 1980's each State and Territory had ALIA Public Libraries Sections (with varying degrees of activity) with presidents of these sections forming the executive of the National Public Libraries Section.

At a planning forum held in conjunction with the first National Public Libraries Conference (Melbourne 1994), it was suggested that the National Public Libraries Section should be abolished. It was perceived that the National Section had been inactive for the previous four to five years.

The matter was again raised at the second National Public Libraries Conference held in Sydney in 1995. At this time discussion also focussed on the proposal that a Confederation of Public Library Associations (CAPLA) be formed to address matters of national significance to public libraries. A working party had been formed and a proposal was under consideration regarding the nature and scope of CAPLA.

Both in 1994 and in 1995 the executive director of ALIA, Virginia Walsh, had put the view that there would be merit in considering the re-vitalisation of the National Public Libraries Section rather than creating a new organisation. This was based on recognition of the role which has developed within the ALIA National Office in undertaking activities of relevance to public libraries, for example lobbying efforts in relation to securing the \$11.4 million commitment from the previous government for community access to on-line information.

The impetus for the re-invigoration of the National Public Libraries Section came with the \$22 000 in surplus funds generated by the 1995 public libraries conference. It was agreed that these funds should be directed towards activities of direct relevance to public libraries and that this could be best accomplished through a National Section which worked closely with ALIA National Office.

The decision to re-establish the national section was confirmed and endorsed during a teleconference held in July 1996. It was agreed that the New South Wales section would take responsibility for the national section until the next public libraries confer-

ence which is scheduled to be held in Brisbane in November 1997. Val Moon, president of the New South Wales section, was appointed the 'caretaker' president of the National Section until November 1997.

The decision to re-establish the National Section was endorsed at a Public Libraries meeting which was held in conjunction with the ALIA Biennial Conference in Melbourne on 11 October in Melbourne.

A range of issues have been canvassed by the re-formed National Section in two teleconferences and one face-to-face meeting. Action identified to date includes:

- an analysis of recent reports and studies relating to public libraries with the view to preparing an 'Issues and action' session at the next public libraries conference;
- a continuous program of publications relating to issues and developments in public libraries will be developed;
- comment will be prepared on the guidelines for the allocation of the \$2 million for on-line access from the Federal Government;
- comment on the Draft Certificate II Traineeship in Local Government Libraries will be prepared;
- a review of the public libraries guideline document *Towards a quality service*; and
- planning for a 'snapshot' of public library activities to be used as a promotional tool.
